**Two-Week Module: May 19–May 29 (Tues–Fri, 8:00 AM–11:50 AM)**

**NT500 Gospel of Matthew: English Bible** (2 hours), Dr. Meyer  
Room 203

An exposition of Matthew's account of the life of Christ, focusing on the dominant themes of the Gospel, the flow of the narrative, and theological and exegetical difficulties presented in the text. Special focus will be given to the unique contribution Matthew makes within the Gospel tradition.

**One-Week Module: June 9–12 (Tues–Fri, 8:00 AM–3:50 PM)**

**CC502 Theology of Missions** (2 hours), Dr. Trumbull  
Room 203

An examination of the biblical and systematic theologies of missions in both the Old and New Testaments, including an emphasis on the mission of the early church in Acts and the Letters. This course also addresses contemporary issues such as holistic mission and incarnational ministry.

**Three-Weekend Module: May 15–16, June 26–27, and July 24–25  
(Fridays, 5:30 PM–9:30 PM; Saturdays, 8:00 AM–2:30 PM)**

**PT522 Basics of Biblical Counseling** (2 hours), Drs. Elwart & Newcomer  
Room 203

This course covers the instructional material in Phase 1 of the ACBC certification process, including an orientation to biblical counseling, various theories of counseling, family relations, frequent issues, and medical issues. This course does not apply toward the MDiv biblical counseling concentration but may be taken as an MDiv or ThM elective.

**Two-Week Module: June 16–26 (Tues–Fri, 8:00 AM–11:50 AM)**

**NT741 Greek Exegesis of 1 Peter** (2 hours), Prof. Pittsley  
Room 203

This course involves the student in translation, syntactical study, and other exegetical procedures. The student is usually asked to write an exegetical paper and attention is given to sermonic development.
